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

Book Review on "Mulan"

My book review is on the book "Mulan" written by Michaela Morgan and illustrated by Steve Dorado. I chose this book as it is very relatable as the protagonist is a girl and it is an inspiring story to read about a simple girl turning into a warrior and becoming the talk of the town.
